Greetings in the name of the Lord, Merry Christmas to all of you and your families! As continuing with tradition I have supplied the Read the Bible in a Year Plan. So here it is the last month of 2024, these newsletters have been going out since January 2008, and some of you have been getting them that long. My prayer is that you have gleaned a deeper relationship with Jesus and made your walk stronger and foundation secure.

Just a little housekeeping request, if you would like to continue receiving these even after you leave TDCJ, please provide me with an address as once you are out of TDCJ we cannot obtain a forwarding address. We do check monthly to confirm your unit assignment within TDCJ and for those in federal custody, we check quarterly as the Feds don't seem to move you as much as TDCJ.

The election is over and regardless of your political persuasion, we must unite like never before. This country has a major impact on the world as a whole, just look at the events of the last week since the election, there have been global reactions. Again, I am not going to be political but God.....

This month I want to look at Psalms 118:24 and what it says, means, and how it applies to us today in our current environment. Psalm 118:24 is a well-known verse often quoted to encourage gratitude and joy. This verse emphasizes rejoicing in the present moment as a gift from God. Here's an exploration of how it reads across the ESV, NASB, Amplified, and NKJV versions:

- English Standard Version (ESV): "*This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.*" The ESV translation is straightforward and concise. It expresses that each day is a creation of God, an opportunity to rejoice and appreciate His presence and purpose for our lives.
- New American Standard Bible (NASB): *"This is the day which the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."* Like the ESV, the NASB translation stays close to the original text's structure, emphasizing God's sovereignty over time. This translation often appeals to readers who seek a more literal wording and focuses on the present as a divine gift.
- Amplified Bible (AMP): "This [day in which God has saved me] is the day which the Lord has made; Let us rejoice and be glad in it." The Amplified Bible expands on the text by adding "[day in which God has saved me]" to suggest a celebratory response to God's saving actions, reminding readers that every day is marked by His mercy. It highlights the concept of personal salvation and God's active role in our lives as believers.
- New King James Version (NKJV): "This is the day the Lord has made; We will rejoice and be glad in it." The NKJV uses "We will rejoice" as an intentional decision to express gratitude. It acknowledges God's ongoing creation of each day and the believer's resolve to celebrate it, fostering a collective response of joy.

Across these versions, the core theme remains consistent:

- Acknowledgment of God's sovereignty: The day is framed as a divine gift from God.
- Joy and gratitude: The call to "rejoice and be glad" is a reminder to live in a spirit of joy.
- Present moment: Emphasis on "this is the day" encourages us to appreciate today, with an awareness of God's role in providing it.

Psalm 118:24 is both a celebration of the day itself and an invitation to adopt a thankful and joyful mindset, reflecting trust in God's plan everyday.

Additionally, there is a call to "rejoice and be glad" in each day the Lord has made, which is a powerful reminder of gratitude, resilience, and faith, especially in challenging global circumstances. Applying this verse to today's complex world situations—such as wars, climate issues, economic uncertainty, and social divisions—can inspire several perspectives:

- Gratitude Amid Uncertainty: In a world facing unpredictable challenges, this verse invites people to find moments of gratitude, even in difficult times. Acknowledging each day as a gift can shift focus from anxieties about the future to finding reasons for thankfulness, no matter how small, in the present.
- Hope and Resilience: The call to rejoice can serve as an anchor for hope. It reminds people that God is sovereign over each day, regardless of external circumstances. This assurance can foster resilience, empowering individuals and communities to persevere through hardship and hold onto the hope that God is working even in situations beyond our control.
- Encouragement to Make a Positive Impact: Understanding that "this is the day the Lord has made" can inspire believers to take action within their sphere of influence, no matter how small. It encourages people to engage in acts of kindness, environmental care, or community service, contributing to positive change in a sometimes overwhelming world.
- Perspective Shift to Joy and Presence: In times of crisis, it's easy to lose sight of joy. Psalm 118:24 urges people to find gladness in the small blessings and be present in each day. This practice of mindful joy can uplift individuals and communities, reinforcing the mindset that joy is still accessible, even in hardship.
- Faith in God's Ongoing Work: This verse reminds believers to trust that God is at work, even when the world seems chaotic. It's an encouragement to rest in His timing and trust that each day serves a purpose in His larger plan, which can bring peace and patience when solutions to global issues seem far off.

So how can I impact any of this from prison, you ask. Well, wherever we are at inside or out becomes our community. We are to as Paul said in Philippians 4:11-13 *"be content in all circumstances"* (read it) he was in prison at the time he wrote it. In today's world, Psalm 118:24 serves as a timeless reminder that God's gifts and presence are with us every day. Holding onto gratitude, fostering hope, finding joy, and committing to daily positive actions can make a difference in our personal lives and in our families as we learn to lead even from within the walls, therefore, impacting the world at large.

May we always look to Him as our source and not to man, knowing, believing, and trusting that He is in control of ALL things, and He will work everything out for our good and His glory to give us a hope and a future. What the enemy meant for evil over the last several years, the Lord will turn it around and we are on our way to that outcome. Keep praying and believing that we are part of God's chosen people!
